The annual alewife run is underway on Long Island ... and one of the best places to see these ecologically important fish is at the Woodhull Dam in the Cranberry Bog County Park, which just happens to be right across the street from the Suffolk County Center in Riverhead!

Seatuck and our partners are working to restore alewife runs across Long Island. They are an important fish in supporting our coastal ecosystem, as throughout their life cycle they provide forage for a wide variety of other species, including everything from striped bass to osprey.

Please stop by during your lunch break from Tuesday's legislative session for an up-close-and-personal look at these amazing fish! We'll be set up from 12:30 to 2:30 with nets, tanks and experts to give you a crash course on alewife. And lunch will be provided!

We hope that you and/or a member of your staff can join us for this unique opportunity!

The Woodhull Dam is located on the east side of County Road 51, directly across from the County Center parking lot (near where the solar arrays begin).
