

2024 Mini-Grant Funding Opportunity for Projects within the Peconic Estuary and Watershed

The Peconic Estuary Partnership (PEP) is pleased to announce the 2024 Mini-Grant Funding Opportunity for projects in the Peconic Estuary and Watershed. PEP invites organizations to apply for a 2024 PEP Mini Grant to implement a project that assists in accomplishing PEP's 2020 Comprehensive Conservation Management Plan (CCMP) goal of Clean Waters for Ecosystem Health and Safe Recreation. For more specific information on PEP goals and watershed delineation, please see the PEP's 2020 CCMP; Actions 16-22, and community outreach projects that apply to these actions.

Key Information

- → Proposals will be considered between \$20,000 to \$50,000 per project.
- → Funds can be applied toward project implementation; outreach and public education; and/or facilitation and planning of water quality endeavors.
- → Money will be dispersed via project reimbursement. The mini grant can be used as funding for a standalone project or contribute to a larger existing project.
- → Applicants must be an organization capable of receiving funds.
- → If your project is chosen, grantees will have to set up a Subaward Contract with Stony Brook University. (Not required at time of application. More information below.)

Important Dates

- → Deadline for mini grant applications is November 1, 2024
- → Winners will be announced December 2024
- → Projects must be completed within one year of Stony Brook Subaward Contract execution. Extensions are possible and will be reviewed on a case by case basis.

Application

Project applications must include:

- Cover Page with the name of the grant (PEP 2024 Mini Grant), Project Title,
 Applicant/Organization name and contact information (physical address, email, phone number and website url if available). Followed by,
- Application Questions/Requirements
 - 1) Applicant Organization Description
 - 2) Project Description
 - 3) Budget and Timeline



- 4) Relevance of the proposed project to the PEP CCMP Goal: Clean Waters for ecosystem health and safe recreation?
- 5) If applicable, how does your proposed project integrate public education, preferably in association with Inclusion, Diversity, Equity, and Access (IDEA) in the Peconic Watershed?

*For Final Grant Awardees only- the subaward contract with Stony Brook University will require:

- Applicants must be an organization capable of receiving funds
- Detailed Task-based Budget
- Summary Budget Table
- Project Timeline
- Quality Assurance Project Plan (QAPP), if necessary.
- Reporting: Quarterly Reporting
- Quarterly invoicing for reimbursement
- Final presentation to PEP Committees
